You can protect your children by making sure your existing blinds have the proper safety devices.

for blind and cord safety

- 1. Make sure your children cannot reach any blind or curtain cords.
- 2. Make sure the bottom of any blind or curtain cord is at least 160cm above the floor.
- 3. Move children's cots, beds, high chairs or play pens away from the windows with blinds or curtain cords.
- Make sure your child cannot climb on furniture and reach blind or curtain cords.
- 5. Wrap blind cords securely around a hook attached high on a wall.
- 6. Install a cord tensioning device for all blinds and looped cords.
- When installing new blinds, seek advice from the supplier about products that use "wands" or motorisation instead of cords to operate the blinds.
